Do you believe you have been wrongly convicted or sentenced for a crime in New Zealand?

Te Kāhui Tātari Ture is responsible for reviewing cases where a person believes they were wrongly convicted or sentenced.

We can review your case and if we consider there are grounds for it to be referred, we have the power to refer your case back to an appeal court.

An important factor we will consider is whether or not you have used all your rights of appeal.

We do not determine guilt or innocence. If your case is referred, you will be given a new hearing in an appeal court.

What you should know before you apply

- Our job is to review your case independently and make a referral if we consider there are grounds for it to be referred. We do not act as your lawyer, but we are independent from the police and the courts.
- To help us with our review, we will need to get a bit of information about you and your case.
- If you would like us to help you complete your application, please contact us on **0800 33 77 88** and we can work through the application with you.
- Alternatively, you may like to ask a family member, friend or someone you trust to help you complete the form.
- You are welcome to work with a lawyer, however there is no requirement to do so.
- There are no costs to make an application to us and if you would like to use a lawyer, you may be entitled to apply for legal aid.

Please try to complete as much of this form as you can, but don't worry if you can't answer everything.



You consent for the Court file(s) be sent directly to Te Kāhui.
- You understand that you are being asked to waive legal professional privilege. This means that any and all confidential information held by, and records of discussions you had with, a lawyer before and during your trial, appeal or after your appeal will be made available to Te Kāhui.
- You are not legally required to waive privilege, but a failure to do so may prevent Te Kāhui from accessing important information and cause delays in the progress of your application.
- You understand that if you apply for legal aid in relation to your application, Legal Aid Services may contact Te Kāhui to confirm you have made an application for review of your conviction and/or sentence. You consent to Te Kāhui advising Legal Aid Services that you have submitted an application.
- You may want to obtain legal advice on these matters before you sign this application. If you need legal help in understanding this application, and in its completion, you can apply for legal aid if you want to.
